To provide funding to programs and efforts that help build a better Brookline for all who live, learn, work, and play here

Overview:

- Funds a wide variety of programs
- Accepts requests for General Operating, Project/Program, Capacity Building, Capital Improvements, Sector building/ Movement building
- Acceptable application formats: online, mailed, emailed

Application Timeline:

- September 12, 2022: Application Deadline
- September 13, 2022 October 31, 2022: Grant Review Period
- November 1, 2022: Grant decisions announced

Safety Net Grant Program

Open for Applications

Rolling Deadline

To provide critical, urgent assistance to organizations helping neighbors in crisis cover the cost of essentials such as rent, food, utilities, child care and more

Overview:

- Funds essential services any and all resources essential to promoting and maintaining health, wellness, safety and belonging
- Acceptable application formats: online, mailed, emailed, call with BCF
- Please contact BCF before applying

Rolling Deadline, Applications accepted year-round, as funding is available

Rolling Deadline

To provide immediate funding to support initiatives intended to make Brookline a welcoming and inclusive community where the rights and dignity of all community members are upheld and protected

Overview:

- Aims to respond to community needs as they arise
- Accepts requests up to \$3,000
- Acceptable application formats: online, mailed, emailed

Rolling Deadline, Applications accepted year-round, as funding is available

Racial Equity Grant Program

Applications opening fall/winter 2022 To support community organizations and efforts working to advance racial equity and racial justice for the Brookline community

Overview:

- Partnership with the Town of Brookline
- Participatory Grant Program
- Racial Equity Grant Committee sets priorities and reviews proposals

Applications opening fall/winter 2022

Youth Development Grant Program

Applications opening fall/winter 2022 Aims to ensure equal access to opportunities for all youth in Brookline, and support and enhance the well-being of youth and their families

Overview:

- Focus on Brookline youth whose families are living on low or limited income, or are underserved
- Eligible youth programs may include:
 - \circ early childhood education
 - out-of-school time programming for middle school students
 - youth leadership development programs
 - mental health services for Brookline youth

eligible organizations

- 501(c)(3) nonprofits organizations
- Town departments or agencies
- Community groups

If an organization or project is new and/or not yet taxexempt, an application may be submitted through a fiscal sponsorship.

fiscal sponsorship

- Overview of Fiscal Sponsorship (what it is/purpose)
- Role of Fiscal Sponsor
- Role of Sponsored Organization / Applicant
- Typical fees for fiscal sponsorship and how to include in project budget

- It's best to outline the responsibilities and obligations of both parties in a written agreement between the fiscal sponsor and the sponsored organization
- If there are organizations interested in being a fiscal sponsor, contact us, you can still apply to the program
- If there are groups without nonprofit status and without a fiscal sponsor, reach out to us early in the process



eligible projects

We can fund:

- general operating expenses,
- project and program funding,
- capital improvements,
- sector-building efforts,
- community- and movement-building initiatives, and
- capacity building



We are unable to fund:

- direct support or scholarships to individuals
- travel costs,
- political campaigns, or
- lobbying

examples of eligible projects

A) Expansion of a current program to include additional services that address the mental and emotional health needs of community members *(Community Grant Program)* B) An effort that aims to reduce the health disparities we are seeing in our community by increasing access to services for communities of color (*Racial Equity Grant Program*) C) A \$2,000 request for funding to offer a dialogue series about racism and to promote anti-racist resources locally *(Brookline For All)*

D) \$15,000 in funding towards an emergency financial assistance program for individuals and families living on low or limited income *(Safety Net)* E) \$10,000 in funding for an out-ofschool-time program that addresses the opportunity gap for students most impacted by the COVID 19 pandemic *(Youth Development Grant Program)*

Fiscal Sponsorship

FISCAL SPONSOR to submit:

- Financial Statements
- Organizational Budget
- Fiscal Sponsor Letter or Fiscal Sponsor Agreement

APPLICANT to submit:

Project Budget

Optional Documents: Supporting documents such as support letters, stories, photos, etc

application formats

Applicants may submit:

- a written/hard copy application
- an online application
- a video application
- by setting up a phone/zoom conversation with BCF staff

Establishing a Community Advisory Council will further enable BCF to live up to our values and allow us to ensure that those who are closest to the issues we are trying to address, are in a position to guide us around the best solutions.



community advisory council



- 10 Council Members
- 75% of Council Members must identify as a member of the BIPOC community or a traditionally and currently vulnerable group (Vulnerable populations includes those consistently excluded from access to resources and services vital for thriving)
- Members of the council must live, work or play in Brookline
