

# Request for Proposals (RFP) BCF Community Grant Program – 2023-2024

Grant Applications Due: Monday, February 12th, 2024 at 11:59PM

BCF invests in organizations and efforts building a more inclusive and equitable Brookline.

As one of the largest funders in Brookline, BCF is committed to partnering with community organizations and programs that advance opportunity for those most impacted by inequities and to focusing our collaborative efforts on addressing challenges head on.

BCF understands that while Brookline is a well-resourced community, we are not an equitably resourced one. Like many communities across the country, Brookline struggles with poverty, food insecurity, gaps in the social safety net, and more. Black communities, Indigenous communities, other communities of color, and vulnerable populations are disproportionately impacted by these challenges. That is why our aim for grantmaking is to make transformative investments in organizations and community efforts that create an inclusive and equitable Brookline for all, and prioritize efforts led by and focused on BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) and other vulnerable populations. This includes but is not limited to BIPOC individuals and/or communities who identify as immigrants, women, children, older adults, LGBTQIA+, disabled, members of racial, ethnic, religious and/or linguistic minorities, incarcerated or formerly incarcerated, and those consistently excluded from access to resources and services vital for thriving.

Through our grantmaking, we work with organizations, efforts, and initiatives with a shared commitment to advancing equity. Our grant programs – Community Grant Program, Racial Equity Grant Program, Safety Net Grant Program, and Youth Development Grant Program – offer ways to partner with BCF to fortify the local safety net, advance opportunities for individuals and families, support pathways out of poverty, and maintain a vibrant, welcoming community.

## **Community Grant Program Overview**

The Community Grant Program provides funding to programs and efforts that help build a better Brookline for all who live, learn, work, and play here.

## **Grant Program Details**

BCF's Community Grant Program aims to support a wide range of efforts that create opportunity and promote equity. We welcome proposals that address a variety of community needs such as, but not limited to, the following:

- Health & Wellness
- Climate Sustainability
- Arts & Culture
- Healthy Aging
- Wealth Building and Economic Mobility Programs
- Housing (including capital improvements, access to affordable housing)
- Crisis Intervention Services (including services that address mental, emotional, and physical health)
- Organizational Capacity Building activities (including Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion training)

*Total amount available to grant*: This fiscal year, BCF has \$109,000 to distribute within the Community Grant Program.

*Maximum Grant Amount*: Grant requests are limited to \$30,000 or below this year. For reference, the average Community grant awarded in fiscal year 2023 was ~\$11,000.

BCF is inviting requests for one-year Community Grants to be submitted through our FY24 grant application. Requests may be for the following: general operating support, project and program funding, capacity building efforts, capital improvements, sector-building efforts, and community-and movement-building initiatives. ## **Priority Considerations**

In alignment with our organizational vision, as we review proposals, we will give preference to community organizations and groups that:

- are working to advance equity (including removing barriers to opportunities, meeting the immediate individual needs of those impacted by inequities, addressing root causes of inequities);
- are led by BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color); and/or
- focus on BIPOC and other vulnerable or marginalized populations, including those populations most impacted by the pandemic

For this grant program, an organization/group is considered BIPOC-led if they meet at least **one of the following three criteria**:

- The organization/group's Executive Director/Chief Executive Officer or Board Chair identifies as BIPOC.
- 50% or more of the organization's leadership staff or program directors identify as BIPOC.
- 50% or more of board members identify as BIPOC.

# Eligibility

Please note: This year, we are asking organizations to submit one application to *either* the **Community Grant Program** *or* the Youth Development Grant Program. Additionally, for the Community Grant Program and Youth Development Grant Program, we will only accept one application per organization. Organizations who are currently funded through the Safety Net grant program <u>are eligible</u> to also apply to Community Grants or Youth Development Grants.

501(c)(3) nonprofits organizations, Town departments or agencies, and community groups can apply for funding. If you are a Town department or agency, please see our <u>additional guidelines</u>. Proposed projects or programs should directly benefit members of the Brookline community, which we define as those who live, learn, work, or play in Brookline.

If an organization or project is new and/or not yet tax-exempt (is not a 501(c)(3) nonprofit), an application may be submitted through a fiscal sponsorship. BCF can assist applicants in identifying an appropriate fiscal sponsor. BCF grants cannot be used to cover travel costs, political campaigns, or lobbying, and we are unable to provide direct support or scholarships to individuals. While we cannot provide direct assistance to individuals, BCF grant programs may fund organizations and groups that provide direct financial support or scholarships to individuals.

To be eligible, an applicant must be operated and organized so that it does not discriminate in the hiring of staff or provision of services on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, gender expression, sexual orientation, age, national origin, marital status, military status, or disability.

- Late April 2024: Grant decisions announced
- May 2024: Grants awarded
